These schools represent each stage of my life. That is my positionality, but through resilience imparted at each stage of my school life, I was frequently reminded of the need to EXCEL. Today, as I present this EXCEL mantra, I challenge everyone to create their own EXCEL so we can make a difference in the lives of others and remember that our work is a calling to better the lives of others, just as we stand on the shoulders of the benefactors of MUT, in particular, the MUT Founder, Prince Mangosuthu Buthelezi
